Marin middle school recipients of Marin Branch scholarships for this year's Marie Curie Tech Trek camp at Stanford have been selected: **Jane Adams** and **Rowan Baechler** of White Hill Middle School, **Olivia Brewster** and **Emerald Lin** from Miller Creek in the Dixie School District, **Trinity Chancellor** of Willow Creek in Sausalito, **Kimberly Flores** and **Aleisha Malones** from Hall Middle School, and **Ruth Mondesir** of Davidson School in San Rafael. To become an AAUW Tech Trekker these girls were all nominated by school staff, then completed an application and wrote an essay which were all paper screened; there were 23 applications this year with 14 chosen for an interview with a branch committee headed by **Amy Anderson**, and including **Joyce Erlenbach**, **Priscilla Hopkins**, and **Ann Thomas**. We look forward to hearing from our young scholars about their adventures at the week-long STEM camp (science, technology, engineering, math) at our September meeting.
