Some Major National Organizations Fighting Racism Against Black Americans

The NAACP. One of the oldest civil rights organization in the U.S. Their website has a wealth of information. The NAACP mission is to secure the political, educational, social, and economic equality of rights in order to eliminate race-based discrimination and ensure the health and well-being of all persons. It is a c4 organization (contributions are not tax-deductible), but it has a partner c3 organization known as NAACP Empowerment Programs (contributions are fully tax-deductible as allowed by the IRS). Annual memberships are \$30 and support the work of the c4 organization. Access to the website is free. <https://www.naacp.org/>

#BlackLivesMatter was founded in 2013 in response to the killing of Trayvon Martin's murder. Its mission is to eradicate white supremacy and build local power to intervene in violence inflicted in Black
